SILVER CROSS TO LAUNCH HEART SURGERY PROGRAM LATER THIS SPRING

S ilver Cross Hospital will soon offer the full spectrum of heart care services our community needs when it launches its new heart surgery program later this spring.

"Heart patients will no longer have to experience the stress and anxiety of having to leave their preferred hospital and travel for advanced heart care," said Silver Cross President/ CEO Ruth Colby.

The hospital will add two state-of-the-art operating rooms, a "hybrid room" equipped with advanced

medical imaging devices to support minimally invasive surgery, and two recovery rooms. In addition, a 16-bed cardiac care unit will open on the first floor directly below the Procedural Care Unit (PCU) to care for patients after heart surgery, and will be serviced with a dedicated elevator between the two units.

With the eighth largest cardiac catheterization program in the State of Illinois, Silver Cross leads the local market for outpatient cardiac procedures performed annually. In 2017 alone, Silver Cross performed more than 3,500 diagnostic and interventional cardiac



catheterizations, an 11 percent increase over the previous year.

"Offering open heart surgery was the next logical step for Silver Cross," Colby added. "We are a hospital well-positioned to expand cardiac services, and we have a safety record that proves it."

Future Structural Heart Program

In addition, the open heart surgery program paves the way for Silver Cross to develop a structural heart program, which uses minimally invasive catheter-based technology to treat life-threatening valve disorders and structural heart defects. This approach lowers the risk of infection and complications, reduces trauma to the chest (since the chest doesn't have to be opened), shortens hospital stays and leads to a faster recovery.

Silver Cross is partnering with Cardiothoracic & Vascular Surgical Associates, a group of highly skilled surgeons known for innovation, outstanding outcomes and very high patient satisfaction scores, that have pioneered minimally invasive valve surgery.

"Patients deserve to have options when considering

where to go for services, especially ones as serious as cardiac services,"

adds Dr. Pat Pappas, cardiothoracic surgeon on staff at Silver Cross. "Silver Cross has the facility, staff and quality to not only support a structural heart program, but to thrive."

What is a Hernia?

A hernia happens when part of an internal organ or tissue bulges through a weak area of muscle. This often causes pain and bulging, especially in the abdomen since that's where most hernias occur.

Hernias affect men and women of all ages and are usually the result of strain on the abdominal wall caused by aging, genetic predisposition, heavy lifting, pregnancy, athletic activities, obesity, previous surgery, constipation, and chronic coughing. There are two types of hernias:

- Ventral hernia is located in the abdomen and may appear at an incision site any time after surgery (incisional hernia).
- Inguinal hernia occurs in the groin area.

TINLEY PARK MAN EXERCISING AGAIN 2 WEEKS AFTER ROBOTIC HERNIA SURGERY

Ken Lehmann of Tinley Park lived with an inguinal hernia for more than a year. It wasn't until he went in for his regular checkup last December that his doctor recommended surgery.

"I remember blowing my nose one day and felt a small pop," he said. "After a checkup with my doctor, he sent me over to Dr. Vasdekas to get checked out for the hernia."

Dr. Thomas Vasdekas, board-certified general surgeon with the Midwest Institute for Robotic Surgery at Silver Cross Hospital, confirmed Lehmann had a left inguinal hernia, and that surgery was the best option to repair it—specifically robotic-assisted surgery at Silver Cross Hospital.

An inguinal hernia occurs when tissue, such as part of the intestine, protrudes through a weak spot in the abdominal muscles. The resulting bulge can be painful, especially when you cough, bend over or lift a heavy object.

While common and not usually life-threatening, inguinal hernias don't go away on their own, Dr. Vasdekas explained. Even smaller hernias eventually grow larger and need to be surgically repaired.

"The advantages with robotic-assisted surgery are that we can make incredibly small incisions to repair the hernia, giving the patient a faster recovery time and with a lot less pain," Dr. Vasdekas said, who has performed more than 1,000 robotic surgeries. "Less pain means patients require less pain medications. We're actually seeing less opioid use with robotic surgeries."

Robotic hernia surgery requires three small incisions, two on either side of the lower abdomen and one through the belly button. The da Vinci robotic system at Silver Cross gives surgeons greater dexterity to perform the procedure, while the small incisions cause less strain on the abdomen making recovery for the patient easier.

Lehmann went in for surgery on Jan. 30, and was back to work two days later. He said he had no pain from his incisions, and only some discomfort from the gas used during surgery.

"Now, all I have are two quarter-inch lines on my stomach, and you can barely even tell anything was done," he said. "I don't think it could've gone any better."

Healthy and active, Lehmann likes to ride his bicycle 300 miles a month when the weather is warmer; he also works out regularly. Thanks to robotic surgery at the Midwest Institute for Robotic Surgery at Silver Cross Hospital, he was only off his schedule for a couple of weeks!

"After I had my two-week checkup with Dr. Vasdekas, he gave me the OK to start working out again. By then I felt like I could do anything."

Woman Vacationing Just Weeks after Robotic Partial Knee Replacement

Every March, Tammy Zeiter and her family vacation in Mexico, but when they were there last year, the Morris business owner started noticing pain in her right knee.

Tests ordered by her doctor showed a torn meniscus and diseased cartilage, causing the bones to rub against each other painfully. But even after a meniscus repair, Zeiter said her pain persisted.

"It would just swell up all the time," she explained. "So I decided instead of having it continuously drained and going through constant problems, I would just get it fixed."

That's when she came to see Dr. Rajeev Puri, orthopedic surgeon with the Midwest Institute for Robotic Surgery at Silver Cross Hospital. After additional tests, Dr. Puri recommended a partial knee replacement as the best option for Zeiter.

With a partial knee replacement, only the damaged part of the knee is replaced, which helps minimize trauma to the healthy bone and tissue. The Midwest Institute for Robotic Surgery at Silver Cross Hospital uses the Mako robotic-arm assisted technology for partial and full knee replacements. The Mako allows for precise placement of the implant.

"Robotic surgery was the best option for Tammy, and using the Mako robot, I'm able to replace the part of her knee that was diseased while helping to spare the healthy bone and ligaments around it," Dr. Puri said. "Two weeks after surgery, and she no longer needed a cane to



walk around. She's even wearing heals and riding a bike in her therapy!"

Three weeks after surgery, Zeiter was feeling great. Walking up stairs is easier, and she's even able to exercise and do squats—something that would have caused her significant pain before surgery. Best of all, she was looking forward to the next family trip to Mexico!

"I'm doing great," she said. "I've already gotten back to work, and even graduated to outpatient rehab a couple weeks after surgery. Dr. Puri, his entire staff, and everyone at Silver Cross Hospital were just amazing. They went above and beyond for me. I told my husband if I ever need anything else done I want to go back to Silver Cross."

WHEN IT COMES TO STROKE, THINK FAST!

When it comes to treating stroke, time is brain! Often referred to as a "brain attack," a stroke occurs when blood flow to an area of the brain is cut off, depriving brain cells of oxygen. When brain cells die, abilities controlled by that area of the brain, like muscle control and memory, are lost, making stroke a major cause of death and disability in the United States today. In fact, every 40 seconds, someone in the U.S. suffers a stroke.

The acronym FAST stands for the warning signs of stroke: Face drooping, Arm weakness, Speech difficulty, and if you witness or experience any of these symptoms, it's Time to call 911 immediately.

Other symptoms include sudden severe headache, dizziness or trouble walking, trouble seeing, confusion and numbness or weakness of the face, arm or leg, especially on one side of the body. Call 911 if you witness or experience any of these, even if you're not sure it's stroke-related. Waiting could be devastating.


