Silver Cross provides 100% financial assistance to uninsured patients who maintain a household income up to 200% of the Federal Poverty Level (FPL). Discounts will be provided to insured and uninsured patients whose income is between 201% and 400% of the FPL. Uninsured patients who do not apply for financial assistance currently receive a 65% discount for medically necessary services. Healthy Community Commission Celebrates 15 Years in 2023

Long before Silver Cross opened our New Lenox campus in early 2012, we had a plan to ensure continued support for residents living near the hospital's former Joliet campus.



\$3.25M in GRANTS & EDUCATIONAL SCHOLARSHIPS The plan included creating a unique organization that would provide support for education, workforce development training and enrichment activities for youth – all with the purpose of enhancing the quality of life for residents on Joliet's east side. The Silver Cross Healthy Community Commission (HCC) was born and has accomplished so much in that time.

The HCC led the charge for the Veteran's Administration to open a mega-outpatient clinic for area veterans in the former Silver Cross Emergency Department, as well as construction of Hope Manor Joliet, a three-story, 67-unit multi-family housing development that offers affordable housing for veterans with disabilities, who were either homeless or at high risk of homelessness.

In 2013, Silver Cross and the HCC also brought to the former campus Aunt Martha's, a federally qualified healthcare center, that provides medical, dental, and behavioral health services to low-income and underinsured populations.

Since its founding in 2008, the HCC has invested more than \$3.25 million for the betterment of our community.



Access to HEALTHCARE

Advancing DIABETES Care

Managing the symptoms of diabetes can be a lifelong battle, but at Silver Cross, patients don't have to face it alone.

As one of the first American Diabetes Association's recognized quality comprehensive diabetes



management programs since 1996, the **Silver Cross Diabetes Center** is focused on helping individuals with diabetes manage their chronic condition and lower the risk of comorbid conditions such as heart disease and stroke.

Services include medication management and insulin instruction; insulin pump therapy; continuous glucose monitoring sensor training; self-blood glucose





monitoring; meal planning and weight management; exercise planning; and management of diabetes during pregnancy.

Taking WOUND CARE One Step Further

For individuals with non-healing or hard-to-heal wounds, **Silver Cross Wound Healing and Hyperbaric Medicine** offers the most advanced care available. In 2023, the center added two hyperbaric oxygen (HBO) therapy chambers that use oxygen under pressure to enhance the body's natural ability to heal.

HBO therapy is especially effective for treating diabetic foot ulcers or leg ulcers; non-healing skin grafts or surgical flaps; surgical wounds that have opened; symptoms arising from radiation therapy; chronic bone infections; and crush injuries.

Access to FOOD& NUTRITION

Access to BEHAVIORAL HEALTH CARE

Access to healthy, affordable food is a key component of obesity and chronic disease prevention and is cited in the **2023 Silver Cross Hospital/Will County Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA)**.

To bridge the gap between chronic disease and food insecurity, Silver Cross Hospital partners with the Northern Illinois Food Bank to address social determinants of health, specifically food insecurity, through its Screen and Intervene Program. The target population of this initiative is food-insecure patients with chronic diseases.

At Silver Cross, all patients are screened to ensure they have proper food, nutrition and healthcare services. As a result, over **4,000 patients** have been screened for food insecurity, and hundreds now have access to this weekly benefit through the online food pantry, **My Pantry Express (MPX)**.



SANE Coordinator *Continues to Assist* **Victims of Sexual Assault**

Sexual Assault Nurse Examiners ensure that sexual assault patients receive more compassionate care. In



Illinois, specially trained nurses are able to reduce re-traumatization of patients and improve the quality of forensic evidence collection, which in turn increases prosecution rates of offenders.

At Silver Cross, all victims of sexual assault are first examined by a physician to make sure

there are no immediate physical traumas to be addressed, such as any wounds or head injuries. They are then offered the services of a **Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner (SANE)**, who is available to the victim within 90 minutes of arrival.

This assures quality patient care; full, fair and accurate forensic evaluations; and a multidisciplinary approach that holds offenders accountable for sexual assault crimes.

Patients are counseled about sexually transmitted diseases, human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) and acquired immunodeficiency virus (AIDS),



pregnancy concerns and referred to other local agencies for additional assistance, including the Guardian Angel Home and the Will County Children's Advocacy Center.
